

## DGM Global Exchange 2018

# November 30 to December 1 Katowice, Poland

The Dedicated Grant Mechanism for Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities (DGM), an innovative financing window within the Forest Investment Program (FIP) of the Climate Investment Funds (CIF), was created to support the full and effective participation of indigenous peoples and local communities (IPLCs) in global efforts to address climate change, including the reduction of emissions from deforestation and forest degradation (REDD+). The DGM has focused its initial efforts on a collection of 14 projects targeting DGM pilot countries, as well as the Global Learning and Knowledge Exchange Project (DGM Global), which facilitates knowledge sharing between the DGM countries and with other key actors in the broader IPLC context.

In its role coordinating between the country projects, DGM Global also promotes effective networking, communications, and results monitoring for the entire DGM. DGM Global is led by the Global Steering Committee (GSC), which is composed of IPLC leaders from the DGM pilot countries as well as one from a non-DGM country to represent other IPLCs around the world. The vision of the GSC is carried out by the Global Executing Agency (GEA). Conservation International, a non-profit organization, was selected as the GEA for the DGM through a competitive bidding process.

The primary goal of DGM Global is to strengthen the role of indigenous peoples' and local communities' engagement in REDD+ and other climate-related programs at local, national, and global scales. The GSC identifies key topics to be covered in each exchange and works with the GEA to ensure that participants gain the capacity needed to advance IPLC priorities and be heard in key decision-making spaces.

DGM Global will hold its Global Exchange from Friday, November 30 to Saturday, December 1, 2018 in Katowice, Poland. The exchange will focus on effective IPLC engagement in climate policy, and it will feature the participation of several prominent indigenous leaders, who are actively engaged in climate action and UNFCCC negotiations.

#### Objective

The main objective of the DGM Global Exchange is to strengthen the capacity of Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities (IPLCs) to fully and effectively participate in COP24 UNFCCC negotiations.

#### Criteria for participants

The application to participate at the DGM Global Exchange is by invitation. DGM National Steering Committees (NSCs) from each nominated DGM Country will provide 3 nominations per country and the DGM GSC will select the best candidates based on the criteria below.

Participants from non-DGM countries will be nominated directly by the DGM GSC cochairs.

- 1. Nominated by DGM National Steering Committee or DGM Global Steering Committee.
- 2. Confirmed accreditation to attend the COP24 Negotiations.
- 3. Member of indigenous peoples or local community organization actively engaging in climate international policy.
- 4. Active participation in the DGM Project at country or global level.
- 5. Aware of the National Determined Contribution assumed by country of origin.
- 6. Committed to disseminating information received with IPLC networks and civil society.
- 7. Valid passport and meets all requirements for travel to Katowice, Poland from November 30 to December 1, 2018.
- 8. Preferably candidates who have not participated previously

Additionally, we would like to invite 7-10 IPLCs already in town going to the COP24. The DGM GEA would cover the cost of accommodations and meals only for the days of our global workshop.
