



### Second DGM Latin America Regional Exchange

June 10-16, 2018

The Dedicated Grant Mechanism for Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities (DGM), is an innovative financing mechanism of the Forest Investment Program (FIP) of the Climate Investment Funds, which were created to support the full and effective participation of indigenous peoples and local communities (IPLCs) in global fora on climate change, including the reduction of emissions from deforestation and forest degradation (REDD+). The DGM includes 13 pilot countries and a Global Learning and Knowledge Exchange Project (DGM Global) that facilitates knowledge Exchange between the DGM countries and other key actors in the IPLC context.

DGM Global, together with DGM Peru, has organized the 2nd Latin America Regional Exchange from June 10-15 in Satipo, Junin, Peru. The learning themes of the Exchange include titling of the lands and territories of indigenous peoples, recognition of communities, natural resource management, and the importance of community land management practices and ecological monitoring.

Additionally, during the regional Exchange, we will have sessions from the Earth Observation for Indigenous-led Land Management (EO4IM) program, which aims to strengthen the technical capacity of indigenous organizations in the Americas to connect the power of Earth Observation (EO) data and strengthen sustainable land management in indigenous territories.

After the regional Exchange, the Annual Meeting of the DGM Executing Agencies will take place in Lima, Peru from June 18-19.

#### Regional Exchange Objectives

The main objectives of this DGM Exchange are:

- To strengthen the capacity of IPLCs to participate in the Forest Investment Program (FIP) and other programs related to climate change at local, national, and global levels.
- To strengthen IPLC organizations and their networks in Latin America by enhancing their representation and voice in national, regional, and global political fora.
- To bring together IPLC leaders from Latin America with different experiences and extertise to learn and share their thoughts on DGM activities in Peru.

#### Learning Objectives for Participants

- Having improved knowledge of the objectives, structure, and governance of the DGM in Peru, Mexico, Brazil, Guatemala, and Ecuador
- Having improved knowledge of opportunities for IPLCs in the Paris Agreement and the LCIP Platform
- Having improved knowledge of REDD+ progress in the region
- Being able to compare and contrast sustainable forest management in the Peruvian Amazon and other DGM countries
- Developing greater knowledge of the importance of communities in land management practices and ecological monitoring
- Being able to compare and contrast land tenure systems in Latin America and to analyze how it effects the enjoyment of the rights of IPLCs
- Being able to articulate how local actions led by IPLCs influence and respond to climate policies at national and global levels





#### Participants from Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities (IPLCs)

This DGM Latin America Regional Exchange is for individuals actively involved in climate change and sustainable forest management. The participants should commit to sharing the knowledge and distributing information with their communities and they should meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Should belong to an Indigenous People or be a member of a local community
- ✓ Participate actively in the DGM program at the local, national, or regional level
- ✓ Be active and familiar with the knowledge systems of IPLCs that contribute to sustainable forest management and land titling
- ✓ Be familiar with the nationally determined contributions (NDCs) set by their countries
- √ Have participated in other conferences and/or networks of organizations linked to climate change or forestry
- ✓ Have participated in national platforms or other conferences related to climate change or forestry at any level
- ✓ Commit to sharing information received with IPLC networks and civil society
- ✓ Can travel to the Exchange in Peru from June 11-15, 2018 and have a valid passport
- ✓ Are familiar with current natural resource management and ecological monitoring practices

# DGM Latin America Exchange ● Day 3: Wednesday, June 13, 2018 Pampa Michi Native Community

The Ashaninka Native Community of Pampa Michi is located 23 km from the city of La Merced Chanchamayo (100 km from Satipo). La Comunidad Nativa Asháninka de Pampa Michi está ubicada a 23 Km de la ciudad de La Merced Chanchamayo (100 kms de Satipo). They live in typical houses, their clothes are cushma and they dedicate themselves to agriculture and craftsmanship.

Among the main challenges, there is teh pressure of two important capital cities that bring intraculturization, los of identity, language, clothing and assimilation. They have oficial recognition of their lands issued by the Directorate General of Agrarian Reformo f the Ministry of Agriculture on June 21, 1977.

They have decided to conduct and experiential tourism Project that benfits the 84 active comuneros considering that the 208 hectares of comunal territory cannot remain agricultural crops. They have built comunal housing, and they are working on the construction of a zoo and community tourist center.

## DGM Latin America Exchange ● Day 4: Thursday, June 14, 2018 Palomar Community

The native community of Palomar belongs to the Ashaninka ethnic group of Selva Central. They speak Ashaninka and Spanish. They are located 70 km from Satipo, on the La Comunidad nativa de palomar pertenece al grupo étnico Asháninca de la selva central. Hablan el asháninca y español. Está ubicada 70 kilometros de Satipo, on the bank of the Perene River, Rio Tambo District, Satipo Province, Junin Region. They have a sizable population with 50 families (250 people between children and adults). They are unionized in the Central Ashaninka of Rio Tambo (CART), within CONAP.

The community has legal status, they have a chief, a steering committee, and the communal assembly. For internal security, they have the local committee of Ashaninka Self-Defense, so the trip and stay in this community is safe and without social risks. There is a Mothers Club, and to receive their visits they are organized with due anticipation.

The community at the pass is Aoti, also Ashaninka, and it has some precarious services. The second community is Chontakiari, only 20-30 minutes before reaching Palomar. It is also Ashaninka, and it is part of DGM Peru pursuing legal recognition, and we will briefly stop in this community. Finally, we will visit Palomar, which is also pursuing legal recognition with support from DGM Peru.
